PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project provides for maintenance and complete streets improvements to the Downtown Core:

- Tampa St from Brorein St to Jackson St;
- Florida Ave from Channelside Dr to Jackson St;
- Brorein St from Ashley Dr to Morgan St.

These roadways will include multimodal improvements to increase the safety for all users in accordance with the City's Vision Zero initiative, which include:

- 1. Parking protected buffered bike lanes with conflict markings;
- 2. Pedestrian bulb-outs to shorten pedestrian crossing distances;
- 3. Enhanced crosswalks to provide pedestrians with more visibility;
- 4. Traffic calming features to control speeds; and
- Reconstructed curb ramps to improve ease of use and accessibility.

BENEFITS TO THE COMMUNITY

- Increased bicycle safety with a parking protected buffered bike lane to create a physical separation between cyclists and motor vehicles.
- Increased multimodal infrastructure with improved bicycle connections.
- Increased pedestrian safety by reducing the crossing distance for pedestrians through curb extensions/bulb outs and installing high emphasis crosswalks, signs, and marking improvements.
- Promotes a healthier and more sustainable lifestyle.
